Q: I attended a seminar about the Notice of Privacy Practices. What exactly is required?

A: Under HIPAA, the Notice of Privacy Practice must contain certain elements.

- It must be written in plain language.
- It must have the header “This Notice Describes How Medical Information About You May Be Used and Disclosed And How You Can Get Access To This Information.” Please review this carefully.

The uses and disclosures must include examples.

- There must also be a description and statement of the uses and disclosures requiring written authorization.
- There should also be something that allows the covered entity to provide appointment reminders or other health-related benefits.

If someone will be contacted for fundraising purposes, this should be stated. If it is a group health plan or health insurance, there should be a disclosure about who information may be released to. There should also be information about individual rights, revising the notice, complaints and who to contact if someone has complaints. Last, but not least, when is the effective date?



ALAMANCE-CASWELL AND GREENSBORO HOSPICE ORGANIZATIONS FINALIZE MERGER

As a final step in the merger between Hospice & Palliative Care Center of Alamance-Caswell and Hospice and Palliative Care of Greensboro, the combined organization has rebranded as *AuthoraCare Collective (AuthoraCare)*. The new name reflects the organization's signature approach to care and the desire to empower people to live on their own terms in the remaining chapters of their lives.

"For more than 40 years, our community-based hospice organizations have provided outstanding end-of-life care and support for tens of thousands of individuals and families," said Kristen Yntema, president and CEO. "As we came together as one organization, we were inspired by the idea that each person we serve can be the author of their care journey with our support. Each story is unique, and each individual deserves to live on their own terms with our expert physical, emotional and spiritual care."

AuthoraCare is now the third largest hospice organization in North Carolina and remains mission-driven and not-for-profit. The merger eliminated overlapping service areas and improved patient care to allow the organization to better focus on fulfilling its mission in a rapidly changing healthcare environment. AuthoraCare projects it will meet the end-of-life needs of nearly 3,000 patients and families across multiple counties in 2020.
