

**Q:** Who enforces the Families First **Coronavirus Response Act?** 

*a*: The U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division investigates claims that employers are not paying emergency sick leave as required by the act.

If an employer denies an eligible employee emergency paid sick leave under the act, the employer will not only owe the sick leave but may also be fined for not following the act.

Employees are eligible, no matter how long they have worked for an employer:

- If the employee is quarantined due to federal, state or local order.
- If the employee has been advised by health care professionals to selfquarantine.
- If the employee is showing symptoms of COVID-19 and is seeking a medical diagnosis.
- If the employee is caring for someone in isolation or quarantine, or must care for a minor child whose school or care facility is closed as a result of COVID-19.

This applies to employers with 500 or fewer employees.

## CONE HEALTH PLANS TO MERGE WITH SENTARA HEALTHCARE

Cone Health announced Aug. 12 that it has signed a letter of intent to merge with Norfolk, Virginia-based Sentara Healthcare. The merger will create a combined organization with a unique value-based approach that is focused on keeping people healthy and well, while providing high-quality, accessible and affordable health care in more ways and in more places, Cone Health said in a press release.

The Cone Health Board of Trustees voted unanimously to move forward with this letter of intent.

The merger is subject to state and federal review and customary closing conditions. It should be formalized by mid-2021. It is expected to take up to two years to fully combine and integrate the organizations. In the meantime, both organizations and their leadership teams will operate as usual.





Congratulations to GMDM's 2020 scholarship recipient, STEFANIE ALLEN, who received \$1,000 from GMDM in August to help with the costs of her nursing education. If her name and face seem familiar, that's because she is a former member of GMDM.



Stefanie spent nearly two decades working in healthcare administration - in

roles ranging from billing specialist to physician liaison to office manager - before returning to school in 2018 to pursue her dream: earning a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing. She is pursuing her degree through a dual program at Winston-Salem State University and Forsyth Technical Community College.

"I was 36 years old when I began, and the prospect of going back to school seemed a bit overwhelming," Stefanie said. "But I decided to face my fear and go for it!"

She credits her time in GMDM with helping inspire her decision to make the leap.

This fall, Stefanie will have to cut her part-time hours further as she begins clinical rotations.


