Q: What is the Coronavirus Relief Bill?

A: Here are a few highlights of the Coronavirus Relief Bill called The American Rescue Plan, which was passed and signed into law on March 11, 2021.

Aid to the unemployed was expanded by the federal government through the extension of \$300-per-week unemployment benefits until September 6, 2021. This is on top of the amount a beneficiary is receiving from state unemployment insurance.

The legislation also provides a direct payment of \$1,400 for a single taxpayer, or \$2,800 for a married couple. An individual who earns up to \$75,000 and married couples earning up to \$150,000 would get the full amount.

Local governments will also benefit by receiving funds for costs incurred until the end of 2024 related to the coronavirus. The amount earmarked for this is \$350 billion.

Schools will also earn additional help for students in kindergarten through 12th grade. This will assist with modifications needed for students related to the virus. The amount here is \$130 billion.

The bill also provides \$46 billion to expand testing, as well as distribution of the vaccine. In health care, the Affordable Care Act premiums would have financial assistance for those who qualify. There is also an incentive for states to expand Medicaid.

Businesses, specifically restaurants and bars that have been hurt by the pandemic, would receive grants and assistance with payroll, rent, utilities and other expenses. This amount is \$25 billion.



Cone Health names its first chief information security officer.

According to a recent report from cloud security company Bitglass, health care data security breaches were up 55.1% last year over 2019 levels.

"Health systems must safeguard information systems to protect patients' data while complying with government data privacy regulations," says Cone Health Executive Vice President and Chief Information Officer Ben Patel. "A dedicated CISO is needed to stay abreast of the changing technology landscape, develop an information security program and to ensure data is secured."

In his role with CISO, McMillian will oversee the information security program, establish cybersecurity and governance practices, work to minimize risks and keep up with the rapidly changing field of cybersecurity.

PACE of the Triad is a nonprofit health and human services agency committed to the wellness of seniors and to improving the autonomy and quality of their lives. PACE is a Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly that provides community-based care and services to individuals who need nursing home-level care, but want to remain at home. Available services include, but are not limited to, an adult day health program, medical care, rehab therapies, transportation, home health, medications and supplies.

PACE of the Triad accepts Medicare, Medicaid and private payment. With the exception of emergency care, all services must be approved in advance by PACE of the Triad. Participants may be fully and personally liable for the costs of unauthorized or out-of-PACE program agreement services.

To enroll in the PACE program, participants must be 55 or older, residents of Guilford or Rockingham counties, able to live safely in the community and determined by the N.C. Division of Medical Assistance to be eligible for a nursing home level of care.




INTERESTING FACTS
