# Fewer Scripts, Better Outcomes The Challenges of Prescribing for Older Adults

As a long-term care pharmacist, Jered Yalung spent years supporting seniors in skilled nursing and assisted living facilities – ensuring safe medication practices and coordinating with care teams behind the scenes. In this presentation, he shares the significant challenges that face older adults taking multiple prescriptions, discusses the dangers of prescribing cascades, and details how "deprescribing" can have positive results.

### THE PRESENTER

Jered Yalung, PharmD, is a licensed doctor of pharmacy who worked for six years as a pharmacist serving residents in senior living communities and skilled care. While he loved the clinical side of medicine and continues to apply that expertise today, he felt a growing need to work more directly with families and the individuals receiving care. Today he serves as agency director for the local franchise of Options for Senior America, a GMDM member organization.




