The Lawyer's Corner

Q: What actions should practices take to avoid disclosure of protected health information on social media?

A: The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office for Civil Rights has announced a settlement with a dental practice for inappropriate use of social media to respond to patient reviews and disclosing protected health information.

This was done when responding to most of the negative reviews. The fine was \$23,000 to a dental practice located in California. This was the second incident for the practice. The practice must update their policies and procedures and train all staff on how to handle protected health information.

Covered Entities should make sure all of your staff understands what they can and cannot do when responding to negative reviews. It is also a good time to review your HIPAA policies and update them as needed. If you have hired a third party to take care of negative reviews, be sure you have a Business Associate Agreement in place with the third party. If a complaint is filed, remember the Office for Civil Rights will ask for a copy of all your HIPAA policies.
