HEALTHCARE LAW & YOU

Q: What are trade secrets? And are they protected under the law?

A: A trade secret is valuable information that a company uses to function that is not available to the public and is kept confidential.

There are many laws, both federal and state, that protect trade secrets. Most conform to the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, which imposes civil and at times criminal penalties.

If you steal someone's trade secrets and use them to make money for you and try to put a competitor out of business at the same time, this is a real problem and can result in monetary awards to the other party.

If your company has trade secrets, it's critical that they are truly kept secret. This information cannot be available to all employees. It must be classified as "top secret," with only a few people privy to it. Many companies require top-level employees to sign an agreement holding them personally liable for the release of such information. These are key if a violation of a trade secret is alleged.

Exercise Physiology Student Is 2023 GMDM Scholarship Winner

C ongratulations to Timothy Isaiah Sellars, who was announced as this year's GMDM scholarship recipient at the annual celebration on Oct. 26.

GMDM has offered scholarships to students in our area who are enrolled in dental, nursing and other health-related programs for many years. Our objective is to provide financial aid that helps students pursuing health care careers succeed in reaching their goals.

Sellars will receive \$1,000, which comes from the money raised through our annual GMDM Charity Classic golf tournament.

Sellars is the son of GMDM member and current treasurer Misti Sellars. He is a second-semester junior attending Winston-Salem State University (WSSU) as a bilingual exercise science major, with a concentration in exercise physiology and a 3.98 grade-point-average.

"I chose to pursue a degree in exercise science (physiology) because of the genuine interest I have in the effects of human health and performance as a result of physical activity, exercise and training," he wrote in his scholarship application. "My immediate goal is to apply to graduate school this semester in hopes of getting accepted into the Early Assurance Program for a doctorate in physical therapy at WSSU. My long-term goal is to have my own physical and massage therapy practice."

In his application, he noted that college comes with a lot of costs and that he has taken on a resident advisor position, which provides him with free housing, to help defray the costs of his education.

GMDM's scholarship, he said in his application, would help further

with those costs.

"It would be a blessing to be selected and receive this scholarship, as it would help tremendously with funding my education," he said in his application.

Sellars plans to use the funds "to pay for graduate school entry fees and part of the cost of the athletic trainer certification that I intend to obtain along my career path."
