Healthcare professionals often face unpredictable and high-stress situations that can escalate quickly. This interactive session is designed specifically for those working in medical and caregiving environments. Participants will learn how to recognize and respond to unwanted contact, use practical tools like pepper gels and tactical pens, and apply simple, effective techniques to de-escalate or escape common physical threats.

With 49 years of experience teaching Korean martial arts and self-defense in Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Arizona and North Carolina, Phillip Jones has developed a unique approach to personal safety. His work focuses on simplifying self-defense techniques for real-world scenarios. The amount of the awards will be announced later this summer.



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



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
